

# FABRIC PAINTING

Materials List

I will be providing the pattern for the flower to the right. We will not be quilting in this class, but will discuss how to quilt your piece. I will bring many examples of my painted quilts.



1. A set of watercolor crayons (There are several brands, I use Caran d'Ache Neocolor, Sargent and Staedtler Karat Aquarell) Hobby Lobby, Dick Blick Art, and Michaels carry them.
2. Any other watercolor pans/paints you may have around the house.
3. One yard of cotton PFD fabric (prepared for dye) Many quilt shops carry it, or you can buy it online.
4. Fabric painting/Textile medium (The art stores listed above carry it.)
5. Light box (if you have one, bring it, don't buy one)
6. Mechanical pencil
7. Blue painters tape
8. Scrap fabric to lay under your PFD fabric. I use about a yard of cheap muslin folded to absorb the wet paint. (This can be used in a future project!)
9. Drop cloth. An old vinyl or plastic tablecloth works well. (The dollar stores have plastic table cloths for a dollar.)
10. Paint brushes (if you don't have them, I'll have lots to borrow)
11. Hair Dryer
12. Painting smock or apron
13. If you have a portable table lamp, bring it, the lighting is not good in the building.

I suggest participants bring a bag lunch and a drink, or the restaurant will be open for those who wish to buy a lunch.
