


The Quilt Shoppe

Welcome From the Festival Coordinator

The theme of the 2024 West Virginia Quilt Festival is "Wild, Wonderful, West Virginia," but please enter your quilts made in any pattern or color you like. We just want to see your work on display at our Festival! This is the year to drag out your camouflage fabrics and panels of wildlife. Or tractors! Maybe you will concentrate on some appliqué projects to highlight West Virginia wildlife, our state's history, or a unique location such as the gristmill at Babcock State Park. You don't have to limit yourself to appliqué. What about a Civil War sampler? Born during the Civil War and attaining statehood on June 20, 1863, the story of West Virginia is ideally suited to such a quilt. And, the opening day of the Festival is West Virginia Day!

We are welcoming back Mary Kerr this year. She has a new exhibit of 20 quilts, "Southern Splendor." Her talk and trunk show after the Friday night dinner are always done in her own inimitable style! She will conduct a 30-minute gallery talk about her exhibit each day of the Festival. And, she will be offering appraisals of quilts, both oral and written. We are switching things around for this year's Festival. One change is that we will not be having the full-day classes on Thursday and Friday. Instead, we are going to offer all of our classes on Saturday, including the always-popular Teachers' Medley. These classes will be much more affordable, and you won't have to haul along a lot of heavy gear. Details are not set at this time. Sign-up forms for classes and the Friday night dinner will be included in a later newsletter.

Whether you are planning a piece to celebrate Wild, Wonderful, West Virginia or are working on a quilt of a completely different style, I urge you to share your work by entering it in our

Festival. There is so much to see, do, and learn at our annual event; classes, vendors, and of course, all the quilts to inspire you. I hope to see you in June!



Documentation, Membership Reminder & Quilts for Sale

Documentation Project

You are invited to participate in the West Virginia Quilt Documentation to be held on the main floor each day of the Festival. The West Virginia Quilt Documentation Project gathers information on quilts that were made in or that currently "reside" in West Virginia.

If you would like to volunteer to help and learn about the process, please contact Roberta Gellner. If you have a quilt to be documented, make an appointment with Roberta, and a team of volunteers will




measure, photograph, date, and identify the quilt pattern. It takes 30-40 minutes to have your quilt documented, and you can either stay and watch the process (highly recommended) or take in the quilt show (also highly recommended!)

Bring information and pictures of the quiltmaker, if available; "maker unknown" quilts are also welcomed. Data gathered will be stored in the WV Culture Center

Archives, and will be uploaded to the Quilt Index (www.quiltindex.org). Information about quilt ownership will remain confidential.



If you are someone who has more quilts than you can give away, or your family has voiced the opinion that you should sell that sewing machine and take up bricklaying, we offer the quilt owner the chance to connect with a buyer. If your quilt is for sale, then we will share your contact information with the potential purchaser. There is a line on the Quilt Entry Form for you to communicate your wishes to us.

The quilts that are for sale are designated on the show floor by a special tag that directs the interested party to the front desk, where the quilt owner's contact information is available. All sales are between you and the purchaser, and the quilt must remain up through the end of the Festival on 22nd June. Good luck!



Friday 5:30 pm - Mary Kerr, Dinner Speaker Gallery Talks and Appraisals throughout the Festival



Mary Kerr is no stranger to the West Virginia Quilt Festival. Always a lively and engaging speaker, she will join us Friday night for an after-dinner lecture and trunk show of quilts from her latest collection, "Southern Splendor."

The American South has a rich quilting history, steeped in tradition and passed down through the generations. Mary worked with quilt historians, southern institutions, and private collectors to display some of the designs, colors, and patterns that are unique to the region. We hope you will enjoy this presentation of unique Southern quilts, and celebrate those who have shared their time and talent.

Come and learn more about these quilts from Mary Kerr during her 30-minute gallery talks each day. Free with paid admission to the Festival.

Mary Kerr is an American Quilter's Society certified appraiser. A quilt appraiser is "expected to assign a value to a quilt determined by a variety of methods. These methods are based upon factual data gathered from consummated sales in the current market place." AQS website

Mary offers both verbal and written appraisals. If you are unsure of which is better for your quilt and needs, don't hesitate to contact Mary. **703.491.3295 or mary@marykerr.com**

When you schedule a verbal appraisal with Mary, she meets with you about your quilt and shares her knowledge of the materials, techniques, and more information about your piece. Mary will tell you the value of your quilt; however, you will not receive a written document with your appraisal. A verbal appraisal is \$25.

If you would prefer a written appraisal, Mary will meet with you about your quilt and gathers information about the piece. After your time with Mary, she researches information pertaining to your item, and prepares a document certified for sale, insurance, or donation purchases, which you will receive in the mail. A written appraisal is \$75.


Officers and Volunteers

Quilt Entry Categories and Boutique

Entering Your Quilt In This Year's Festival

<u>First</u>, Is your quilt made by one person from beginning to finish, two people, or three or more? Pick the appropriate category... **Individual**, **Duet** or **Group**.

The remaining categories are Non-Judged; they are Clothing/Accessories/Home Décor, Youth, and Display Only.

<u>Second</u>, Is your quilt <u>Pieced</u>, <u>Appliquéd</u> or a <u>Mix</u> of techniques? This should narrow your choices to two or three possibilities.

<u>Third</u>, Measure the outside or the **perimeter** of your quilt and check the box that fits your quilt.


Reminder – Your quilt must have been completed after January 1, 2019.

<u>Finally...Sleeves</u>- All quilts must have a 4-inch hanging sleeve securely attached to the back of your quilt. This sleeve should measure <u>86 inches from the bottom of the quilt to the top of the sleeve</u>. See the Festival Entry Instructions for more information or visit our website...

The Boutique

Did you ever ask yourself, "What was I thinking when I bought that piece of material? Why did I buy so much of that fabric?! I can't believe I bought that ruler when I already have it! Why am I just hanging on to that old machine, cutting mat, patterns, magazines and books, etc."

Well, we have a solution.... the Boutique at the West Virginia Quilt Festival!

In addition, we will be at the WVQI Retreat at Cedar Lakes this spring, if you would like to bring your quilting items there. And don't forget—you can always bring your items to the Festival with you.

Please note that due to their weight, bulk, and unsuitability for quilting, we cannot accept donations of jersey, double knits, or unrelated quilting items.

So pack a box or more for the Boutique, and just think of all the room you will have to buy more fun stuff from the vendors at the Festival!


